# FEEDBACK

## Staff

- 97% of staff were satisfied with the program
- 98% felt supported
- 64% said they would return next year
- Staff reported that they liked the 4 days week and being done before the 4ht of July.
- Next year: Supply closet, supervision schedule logistics, ESY planning time, and some summer school treats.

## Parents

- 94% of parents reported that children had a positive summer school experience
- 95% of parents were satisfied with the summer school program
- Parents liked the open house and the variety of classes offered.
- Next year: They ask for a balance of age groups open when registration begins (this year, we had to add classes in some periods after registration began).



# IDEAS FOR SUMMER SCHOOL 2026

***BASED ON PARENT/STAFF FEEDBACK***

## **Registration/Classes**

- Continue to look for new classes to add to the catalog
- Look at this year's numbers and make sure we have enough classes for the most popular ages
- Tighten the grade level bands

## **Calendar/School day**

- Open House was a success so we will continue to add that as an option for families
- 4-Day week was popular with most
- Continue with at least a few days between the end of school and the start of summer school

## **Location/Arrival/dismissal**

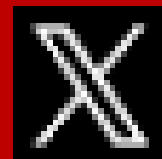
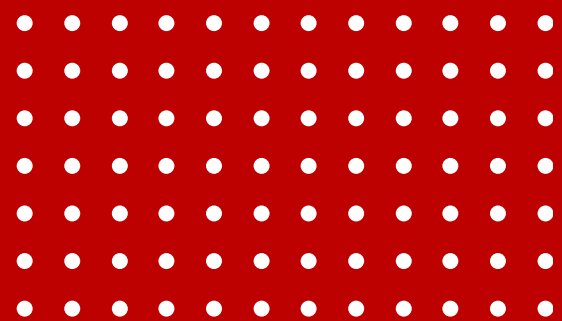
- Keep summer school at Copeland for consistency
