ACT Test for Senior's

Saturday October 26th was ACT test day at HHS. Seniors will have another opportunity to take the ACT on December 14th. The registration deadline for this test is November 8th. The December ACT will be at Caldwell High School or the College of Idaho. HHS does not host the December test.

Students may prepare for the ACT by creating a march 2 success account at http://march2success.com. Idaho students have free access to the online ACT test prep course and may access that by logging into the ACT account they set up when they registered for the ACT.



Homedale High School Crop Management Class Lends a Helping Hand at a Lavender Farm



On Wednesday October 3rd, the crop management class had the opportunity for a real, live hands on experience moving lavender plants from a greenhouse and planting them in a 5-acre field. By the end of the day over 4000 lavender plants were planted!

It will take two-three years for the plants to mature. At that point the lavender could be harvested for dried flowers, buds or the oil. The farm is located west of Caldwell.

College Application Week was October 21st-24th:

October 14th-17th was College Application Week at Homedale High School. Mrs. Flaming and the TriO representative Ms. Martinez visited the government classes to help seniors apply to colleges. Students who are considering the military, are encouraged to apply to at least one college. In order to apply to college's, student will need their social security number and need to know the exact spelling of their legal name. The Idaho State Board of Education through the Next Steps website has created an online application where seniors can apply to 10 Idaho colleges at once without needing to pay the application fee.

For fun students dressed up as nerdy as possible. Mr. Swallow and Mr. Lyons character time during advisory focused on drug awareness messages all week with a presentation by Mr. Swallow in the cafeteria. On Monday during lunch students enjoyed the movie Napolean Dynamite. All the student officers went to a leadership conference at WaHoo's Galaxy Center in Meridian. At the workshop students learned about helping to promote school spirit, how to do pep rallies, dances and fund raising campaigns. **Tuesday** was Positive Friends Day and the Red Ribbon theme was Hawaiian with the message "Lei off Drugs". Students were invited to Mrs. Forsberg's art room to make reverse tie dye

t-shirts to wear for Wednesday's theme day. **Wednesday** was Spirituality Day and the Red Ribbon theme was *Peace Out to Drugs*. For fun students dressed up in tie dye. During advisory SOS student leaders taught a lesson in advisory using a tower building activity with marshmellows and dried spaghetti, which encouraged working together and cooperation. Students competed in small groups to build the tallest structure in 7 minutes. During lunch a



game was set up to encourage students to get to know one another better called "Two Truths and a Lie".

Thursday was Healthy Activity Day and the Red Ribbon theme was "Be of Good Character, Be Drug-Free". Students were encouraged to dress up as their favorite character to celebrate. The day kicked off with SOS peer leaders serving free hot chocolate and apple cider before school in the morning. The HHS teachers and staff got into the spirit of it by



dressing like zoo animals and Mr. Holtry dressed up as the zookeeper. During lunch the old gym was opened for students to come and listen to music provided by Mr. Lee and to get their photo taken. After lunch, Red Ribbon Week activities concluded with an assembly with guests who shared personal stories from their experience about the importance of having mentors in preventing suicide. A very emotional presentation was given by a Homedale High School parent whose son graduated from HHS a few years ago, who just entered a drug rehab center for the 6th time. She explained how drug abuse impacts families and the community and why it is important to stay away from drugs.

It was a great week. Positive SOS messages about Help, Hope and Strength will continue to be spread at throughout HHS with other upcoming campaigns in November and December.

Idaho Opportunity Scholarship:

Recognizing the need for a well-educated workforce, former governor Butch Otter and the Idaho Legislature established the Opportunity Scholarship, to remove barriers to higher education and prepare college/university graduates to enter the workforce. The Opportunity Scholarship awards eligible applicants up to \$3,500 per year and is *renewable for up to four years*.

The scholarship funds are available per school year; recipients must re-apply each year and are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of four years.

To qualify for the scholarship, a student must meet all of the following criteria:

- Have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 2.7 or above
- Be an Idaho resident
- Be a graduate from an **Idaho high school** or its equivalent (GED/HSE from Idaho)
- Complete the State Board of Education scholarship application by March 1
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 1
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress for financial aid purposes.

Idaho Governor's Cup Scholarship

2020-21 application reopened 11/1/2019. Career/Technical Deadline 2020-21 application opened 11/1/2019.

- Merit-based award
- Requires community service
- For graduating seniors of an Idaho high school
- Requires a 2.8 GPA

Depending on funding, the Idaho Governor's Cup Scholarship provides approximately 25 awards to Idaho high school seniors planning to attend an Idaho college or university. Funds are awarded to students pursuing academic or career technical education. This is a \$3,000 award, renewable up to four years for academic programs and up to three years for career technical programs.

Eligibility for the Governor's Cup Scholarship:

To qualify for the scholarship, a student must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be a resident of Idaho
- Be a graduating senior of an Idaho high school
- Enroll as a full-time student in an academic or technical program at an Idaho college or university, taking the ACT or SAT if enrolling in an academic program
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or above
- Attend the first semester of college following graduation
- Write a 500-word personal essay about your goals and interests

Documentation of volunteer work, leadership, and public service is required

6 Things Needed to Fill Out the FAFSA

The FAFSA application website opened October 1st. While the deadline to be considered for federal student aid is June 30, it is recommended that students complete the application before priority deadlines for colleges and universities. These deadlines typically fall between December 1st and March 31st, for fall admission dates. Meeting priority deadlines means that students will be considered for the widest array of financial assistance (loans, grants, scholarships). In addition, the Idaho Opportunity Scholarship requires applicants to complete the FAFSA by March 1st. On November 7th seniors will have the opportunity to start their FAFSA applications during Government and all day during elective classes in the



computer lab by the library. Thursdays all throughout the month of November are senior support days for college applications, scholarships in the computer lab by the library.
