DROP OFF AND PICK UPS

NEWS UPDATE

A message from Oregon Books Bookstore in downtown Grants Pass

Encouraging children to read falls heavily on our local libraries. With funding cuts, being able to purchase books that are in demand is often very difficult. To assist your library, Oregon Books has altered our partnership program to provide a direct credit to the Manzanita library which can be used at any time. The program works in this fashion; any supporter who mentions Manzanita when purchasing books triggers a donation of 5% of the total purchase. (Sorry, we must exclude institutional discounts from this program.) When Manzanita supporters order books through www.oregonbooks.com, just add "Manzanita" in the comments section or mention it when they pick

up their books. Here's an example of how all this works: if you have 50 supporters buying \$10.00 worth of books each month, your library would have\$300 during the year to spend! Join Oregon Books in helping your library receive money to help students have new reading material!
