**AGENDA ITEM:** SAVVAS enVision Math Curriculum Materials

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

- Per Board Policy CH (Legal/Local), purchase of goods or services valued at \$50,000, or more, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place.
- Proclamation 2014 was the last K-8 math adoption for the state of Texas. In Spring of 2014, the Board of Trustees approved the adoption of the SAVVAS (formerly Pearson) enVision Math Curriculum to be implemented in the fall of 2014 with purchased materials lasting through the 2021-2022 school year.
- As a result of the state pushing back the math adoption timeline, districts will need to consider supplementing the original purchase to account for the next four years leading up to the next math adoption.
- The enVision Math Curriculum is a quality resource that is utilized consistently across the district. For continuity, the district would like to purchase student instructional materials that align with the teacher editions that teams are already familiar with and were purchased in the previous adoption.
- For districts who adopted the enVision Math Curriculum, SAVVAS is offering a 56% discount to assist districts that choose to provide the same teacher and student materials throughout the 4-year gap.
- The cost associated with purchasing K-5 grade enVision Math Curriculum materials for the 2022-2023 school year is as follows:
  - enVision Math Digital Courseware 4-Year License Extension: \$15,426.84
  - enVision Math Student Edition 4-Year Subscription + Digital Courseware 4-Year License Extension: \$98,246.06
  - Total Purchase: \$113,672.90

### **FISCAL INFORMATION:**

The purchase cost of \$113,672.90 will be paid from the Instructional Materials Allotment, Fund 410.
