7.A. Awards and Recognitions

Staff members that received the Golden Apple grant were introduced for receiving over \$17,000 in grants. Some of the recipients appeared Christine Franklin, Olson Park, for "Ozobots: Coding and Robotics", students visit Challenger Learning Center and Stem Lab using little robots and coding with color and movement, and then they will use codes for the robots on a mapping trail received \$2,400; Mindy Rice with Erin Schutt from Loves Park Life Skills received a \$230 grant called a Toniebox, to engage students in multisensory ways by taking figurines to play stories for children with physical disabilities, grant was received from the Blazer Foundation; Machesney Art Teacher, Ingrid Hyde, received the Golden Apple grant, making a collaborative mosaic mural for the front area of the school to include all students welcoming people to the school, receiving \$450 from Sam's Club.
