

1. Purpose and Mission

The purpose of the MHHS Art Club is to provide a welcoming space for students of all skill levels to create art, explore different mediums, share ideas, exhibit work, and build a creative community at school. The club celebrates creativity without judgment and encourages experimentation and teamwork.

2. Membership

- a. Membership is open to any currently enrolled student at MHHS regardless of artistic experience or skill level.
- b. There are no dues required to join.
- c. Members are expected to treat others and club materials with respect. Repeated disrespectful behavior or vandalism of supplies may result in removal from the club after a warning.

3. Meetings and Activities

- a. Regular meetings will be held the second Tuesday of the month in Room 17 at 11:30 am..
- b. Additional workshops, open-studio sessions, field trips, or guest artist events may be scheduled with at least one week's notice and the guest artist will have successfully completed the necessary paperwork required by MHHS.
- c. Members are encouraged but not required to attend every meeting. Consistent participation (attending at least 50% of meetings) is required to vote on major decisions or hold an officer position.

4. Leadership Roles

- a. The club will have the following positions: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Social Media/Events Coordinator.
- b. Leaders will be elected by majority vote each spring (or fall) and serve for one school year.
- c. Any member in good standing (no major behavior issues and meets attendance requirement) may run for office.
- d. The faculty advisor, Angela Schneider, has final approval on all officer elections and major decisions.

5. Decision-Making and Spending

- a. Major decisions (spending over \$50, planning large events or murals, choosing themes for school exhibits, etc.) will be decided by majority vote of members present at a meeting.
- b. The Treasurer (with the advisor, Angela Schneider) will keep track of any club funds and present a simple budget report once a year.

c. All money raised or spent must benefit the club as a whole (supplies, exhibition costs, charity art projects, etc.).
