Teaching, Learning & Relevance

- Six Seniors showing Academic & Career Plans in manufacturing were provided an opportunity to complete an in-depth job shadow with PCA and LP. They spoke directly to employees in various job types along with the Human Resource Departments. Those electing to were allowed to complete application paperwork and begin the initial phases of the process. Thank you to both companies for their support of students who desire to enter the workforce directly and begin employment.
- THS will be offering a Nicolet course on campus called Firefighter 1. This course is part of Nicolet's Public Safety programs and is in the sequence of courses that lead to a fully trained Firefighter certification. Students will earn the Firefighter 1 certification for successful completion and may continue through the Nicolet sequence of courses. Firefighters are in high demand and as a result, this certification is noted on the DWD Technical Incentive Grant for high demand certifications. Additionally, students who earn the Firefighter 1 certification are personally eligible to receive a \$500 stipend directly from the DWD. There are currently 11 students enrolled to take the course for Semester 1, 2024-25.
- Graduation Commencement took place at 7:00 p.m. on May 24th. Eighty-six seniors participated in the ceremony and celebrated their accomplishments. Thank you to the various school organizations and departments that planned and conducted the event.
