


# March 17, Saturday Arrive Dublin/Killarney

Meet our Irish guide and our USIT tour conductor on arrival and board your luxury motorcoach to drive to Killarney via the castle at the Rock of Cashel. This outcrop of rock in the central plains of Munster was the seat of the High Kings. We stop here and visit and after lunch we travel on to

We journey around the Ring of Kerry today, a tour of constantly changing mountain and coast-line scenery. The road winds between the Macgillycuddy's Reeks, the highest mountains in Ireland, and the Atlantic Ocean and we'll enjoy plenty of stops to admire views. Travel through Caherdaniel and Waterville at the west-ern end of the peninsula and enjoy the bracing Atlantic breezes. Continue our drive through the colorful village of Sneem and the vantage point of Moll's Gap through the National Park to Killarney and back to the hotel. We'll sing mass and a concert tonight at the impressive St. Mary's Cathedral. Hotel and dinner: Dromhall Hotel.









#### March 20, Tuesday Connemara and Kylemore Abbey






## March 21, Wednesday Dublin City.
