ACADEMIC OVERVIEW:

We have received information from Willamette Promise regarding the students who took classes for college credit during the 2015-2016 school year. Sheridan High School had 27 students earn 102 credits which would have cost the district \$212.25 per credit and gave us a potential savings of \$21,649.50. The breakdown of the subjects taken and the number of students receiving credit are:

- Computer Science - Six students earned 18 credits
- Writing – Eight students earned 32 credits
- Spanish – Eight students earned 32 credits
- Math – Five students earned 20 credits

From other institutions:

Chemeketa Community College

- Various classes - One student earned 42 credits for \$4,032.00

Linn Benton Community College

- Animal Science - Ten students earned 40 credits in Animal Science for a total of \$3,840.00

TOTAL POTENTIAL SAVINGS - \$29,521.50

PBIS:

I would like to thank our participating local partners who have supported our PBIS reward system: Alvarado's Tacos Valle La Providencia, Subway of Sheridan, and Kathy Byers' Bridge Street Coffee House.

Something new that we are adding this year is Student of the Month. Two students from each of the four classes, one male and one female, will be selected by teachers each month, based on the four characteristics of involved, respectful, safe and responsible. Students will be awarded with a t-shirt and special recognition.

Reward parties scheduled for the school year are:

- A six-week attendance celebration based on school attendance of 93% or higher;
- A nine-week Ice Cream Social for students with a "C" or higher grade in all classes, one party each nine-week period;

- And an end of the year special celebration for the class who has the least discipline referrals, best attendance, and best grades.

College Career Day:

On October 11, 2016 Sheridan High School will be hosting a College Career Day for local schools, including Amity, Willamina and Nestucca among others. The ninth graders will be bussed to various college visitations (including Linfield, OSU, WOU, OIT, Corbin, Chemeketa, Pacific and Willamette University, while the tenth through twelfth grades will stay in Sheridan and attend college and career activities at the Career Expo at Sheridan High School.

STARS Training:

Staff had the opportunity to be trained by Phil Kelly, from Edtech, this past Monday on the use of STARS. STARS will be used as a screening for Freshmen at Sheridan High School in Math and Reading.
