Overview of program year: The program was started this year during the first semester with 1 student and ended with a total of 2 students who passed through the program. Of those students, 2 have met requirements for graduation.

Success stories: The goal of the program is to offer flexible hours and days of attendance for students in **any** grade who have dropped out of school or are at risk of dropping out which in turn will help improve graduation rates.

• Of the 2 seniors enrolled in this program, 2 have graduated.

Recommendation from Alternative School Staff for 2024-2025: This program has proven successful and should be continued with ongoing input, adjustments, and collaborative effort by teachers, counselors and administrators.

Issues to consider and address in the future if the program is renewed:

- Record keeping has improved and is constantly monitored.
- Communication between the APHS Principal, Attendance Clerk and the Counselors when recommending students for OFSDP.
- We will continue to utilize the district truancy officer as student liaison.

Our adherence to guidelines identifying candidates for the OFSD program has insured that we are providing a much-needed service to those students affected by life situations and other obstacles that might hinder their education.
