

- Those who ride a bus will need to go into a teacher's classroom until the buses arrive.







Great Job Robotics!

On Saturday, November 15th, Tsunami Zone attended Meet 1 of the FTC robotics competition. Our first game was a close one at a 64 - 57 loss but was very improved from the last meet. What ultimately decided this match was tragically our alliance's human player having their hand in the field, granting the opposition enough penalty points to win. Though unfortunate, it reflects well on us. It shows that our team can conquer the other more advanced teams, and I suspect we will if we come to the next meet with a good understanding of the rules and more caution surrounding penalties. Less significantly, though I would say it's worth remembering, a member of The Swagletons was wearing a 2 foot tall hat with a skull on it.

Our second match was a great win at 82 - 49 where we saw enormous success in our ability to aim and shoot balls with accurate repetition. The other robots in this match were quite large. I think this was an advantage for us. They had a lot of trouble maneuvering around each other, especially with one robot getting stuck in the middle after their successful autonomous, and there was frequent crashing. We on the other hand were able to dart between them and move precisely, giving us more control over the field. We were also the most accurate. I remember one robot on the red alliance launching balls almost straight up, rarely landing one in the goal. We also had a perfect parking job

Tsunami Zone's third round was a 111 - 104 loss but a funny round because Britton got to "feed the robots". Britton got to hog all the balls on the field then gave all of the robots in our alliance as many balls as was needed. Our score could have been much better had we not emptied our ramp in the endgame, forfeiting all our pattern points. We had a new drive team this round attempting to learn the ropes, and they were greatly impacted by the chaotic field and field setup.

The fourth round was probably the best out of all of them for Tsunami Zone because we had a 169 - 83 point win, which was the second-highest score of the meet, though not through our excellent play - we benefited from massive penalties from the other alliance. The fourth round was a normal round in the start but in the middle of the Tele-op, the other team emptied our own gate (which is a major penalty) and all balls inside counted for 10 points for us if emptied which led to us being granted a whopping 105 penalty points at the end of the match.

Match 5 was rough. We were against some of the best teams, and though we went into the match with a really good plan with our alliance, new driver jitters definitely impacted our team. Our opponent RevAmped Robotics had an almost perfect autonomous scoring - which encourages us to really focus on building out our autonomous programming so that we can compete during the early portion of each match.

In general, launch accuracy and driving agility were our greatest strengths in this meet. We were among the most consistent when shooting balls, and could maneuver well. Penalty points were prominent in many matches, whether from minor mistakes, blunders, or schemes. The teams with functioning autos had a big advantage over those who didn't. One robot could get a thirty point head start by themselves with an autonomous program.



Oregon Law: ORS 339.010

- All children between the ages of 6 and 18 years who have no completed the 12th grades are required to attend regularly a public full-time school during the entire school term.
- Students are considered irregular attenders when they meet any of the following:
 - 8 unexcused one half days absences in any four week period
 - 5 absences (excused or unexcused) in three months
 - 10 absences (excused or unexcused) in 6 months
- Chronic absences means missing 10% or more school days in a year for ANY reason. That is nearly a month of school. Chronic absenteeism includes ALL absences, consecutive or not, excused or not, as they all relate to a student's overall attendance.

Build the habit of good attendance early!

Our goal is to have all students attend 90% or more of the time. We appreciate your support as we work to reach this goal!

Our November regular attender rate is below:

Freshman: 71% (up by 4% from October)

Sophomores: 71% (down by 4% from October)
Juniors: 61% (down by 12% from October)
Seniors: 53% (down by 15% from October)

Overall Regular Attender Rate: 64% (down by 7%)
