<p>Summary:</p> <p>Senate Bill 2 (SB2) of the second called special session of the 88th Texas Legislature made significant changes to the composition of the CAD Board of Directors.</p> <p>For Hunt County Appraisal District, there are two spots up for reappointment for a full four-year term beginning January 1, 2026. For 2026, each taxing entity may nominate up to two candidates. Once all nominations have been received, the appraisal district will mail each entity a ballot for voting purposes.</p> <p>After this appointment, there will be entity appointments every two years, with two members being appointed on one cycle and three members being appointed on the second cycle.</p> <p>By October 15, 2025, each entity must submit their nominees by way of resolution.</p>
