Cross Middle School is nestled at the base of Pusch Ridge in the Catalina Mountains. Cross has high academic and behavioral expectations for students and promotes a variety of opportunities for students. We offer accelerated courses such as Algebra 1, Geometry and Spanish 1 for high school credit. Our athletic programs have a rich tradition of excellence and we also have a very strong fine arts program offering band, orchestra, choir and Musical Theater. A great deal of teacher, parent, student and community involvement adds to the Cross educational experience. Our staff at Cross believes that the students we educated today can and will be the leaders of tomorrow.

Cultural and Demographic Data:

- > Enrollment: 655 Students
- > Open Enrollment: 176 Students which is 27% of the total enrollment.
- Feeder Elementary Schools: Copper Creek, Donaldson, Harelson, Mesa Verde
- Cross has a very small ELL population (1.3%) 2014-2015 school year.
- > 19.2% of our student population is identified gifted in at least one area in the 2014-2015 school year.
- > Students identified Special Education make up 16.5% of our school population
- Average Daily attendance rate in 2014-2015 was 93.4%
- Student Mobility Rate in 2014-2015 was 16.3%.
- ➤ On the Cross campus we have a self-contained classroom for students identified with severe social/emotional/behavioral disabilities and there are 6 students in that program.
- ➤ 36% of students at Cross Middle School qualify for free and reduced lunch.
- > There are six churches surrounding Cross Middle School and they are very active members of the community. The churches donate materials and supplies to the school and have volunteers that are active on our campus. They also allow us to use their parking lots before and after school to accommodate parking.
- Cross Middle School has many active partnerships with the surrounding business community.
- ➤ The school was built in 1974-1975 and many members of the parent population were students here or long time members of the Amphitheater district.
- Cross has a great reputation for developing the whole child. We have strong academics, outstanding fine arts and competitive athletic teams.

AIMS 8th Grade Science:

74% of Cross 8th Grade students met or exceeded the AIMS Science test.

Academic Goals for the 2015-2016 School Year:

- 1. As measured by the 2015-2016 fall to spring MAP test, 100% of our continuously enrolled students will make at least one year's growth in the area of math.
- 2. As measured by a Pre and Post writing assessment 100% of continuously enrolled students will increase their average of all 6 traits by one point as measure on the 6 traits of writing rubric.
- 3. As measured by the 2015-2016 fall to spring MAP test, 100% of our continuously enrolled student will make at least on year's growth in the area of reading.
- 4. As measured by Tyler Student Management System, Cross Middle School will have at least a 95% attendance rate.
