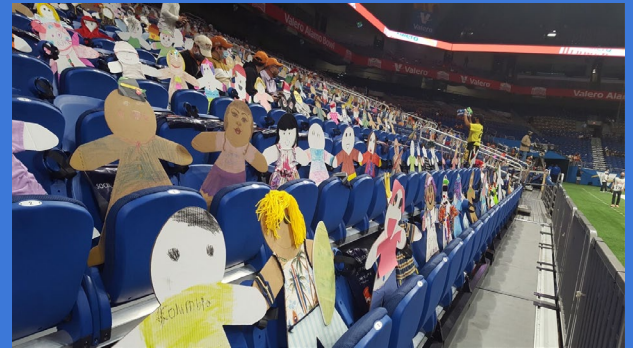

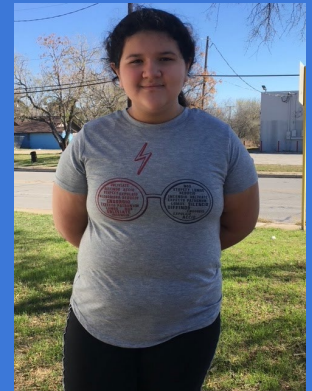

- **Mission:** Empowering individuals and families to transform their lives and strengthen their community.
  - Founded in March 1903, a new social agency opened in San Antonio for the first time with a goal of providing financial assistance to needy families.
  
- **Family Service has partnered with South San Antonio ISD since 1991-1992;**
  - FAST- Families and Schools Together- Family Program with families of 5 yr olds, early enrichment program
  - Read and Rise- literacy program for early childhood
  - FAST Works- Extension of FAST (Graduated families from FAST)- Parent Enrichment
  - Youth Education- After School Activities- STEM, Life Skills, Youth Internship Program, Strengthening Families Program, Mobile Mental Wellness services
