## What are Federal Settings

A Federal Setting refers to the percentage of time a student spends in Special Education away from their Mainstream Peers

Federal Setting I0-21% of the day is in Special Education ClassroomsFederal Setting II21-60% of the day in Special EducationClassrooms60% or more of the day in Special EducationFederal Setting III60% or more of the day in Special EducationFederal Setting IVSeperate site Special educational facility

## How/Why are Students Placed between Settings

The LRE, or Least Restrictive Environment must always be considered when moving students from one Federal setting to another

#### The Law states :

LRE means that a child with a disability must be educated within the same classroom as typical mainstreamed non-disabled peers to the fullest extent possible in order to ensure that a disabled child is receiving a free appropriate public education (FAPE)

The least restrictive environment (LRE) is a legal term found within 20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(5) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The LRE provision of the IDEA provides that: "To the maximum extent appropriate, children with disabilities, including children in public or private institutions or other care facilities, are educated with children who are not disabled, and special classes, separate schooling, or other removal of children with disabilities from the regular educational environment occurs only when the nature or severity of the disability of a child is such that education in regular classes with the use of supplementary aids and services cannot be achieved satisfactorily." 20 U.S.C. § 1412(a)(5)(A).

## **Brookside Academy Overview**

#### Staffing

- Five Special Education Teachers
- Ten Academic Behavior Managers

Students - 20-30 students (always changing)

- Students join throughout the year
- Not a forever placement, students earn back time in their mainstream school based on behavior data
- All students are on an IEP
- Students are placed in groups based on ability



## **Brookside Academy Overview**

# Students who attend Brookside experience an innovative school program where they:

- Focus on building strong relationships with peers, adults
- Experience customized learning with small class sizes and hands-on learning
- Experience a warm, safe, and fun learning environment that models a "traditional" school
- Enjoy a calm learning environment with sensory rooms and unique learning spaces
- Learn tools for effective social-emotional skills, self-regulation, and self-advocacy
- Are treated with respect, compassion, and dignity by school staff



### **Brookside Academy Overview**

#### **Brookside Staff:**

- All trained in Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI)
- We have specialized support such as Academic Behavior Managers, mental health (Lighthouse,) a nurse, and social worker
- Strong values of restorative justice, positive behavior supports, processing through all student behavior as they happen
- Help students emotionally regulate so they can access their learning to return to their mainstream school with the skills necessary to navigate their day feeling in control of their emotions and how to cope without having a big outburst



## Criteria to go back to mainstream (Changing their LRE)

All students have pointsheets that measure different behavior categories every 15 minutes

#### **Areas Measured:**

- On Task
- In Place
- Following Directions
- Accepting Feedback
- Positive Interaction / Personal Space
- Appropriate Language

#### **Transition Criteria :**

- Students who achieve 80% across all areas measured after 6 weeks will start a two hour add at their home school (Mainstream)
- Adds continue every 4-6 weeks depending on students success rate in both settings
- A full successful transition can be completed in roughly 4 months

#### **Areas Measured:**

- On Task
- In Place
- Following Directions
- Accepting Feedback
- Positive Interaction / Personal Space
- Appropriate Language



### Who we service

We have students with many different disability areas, and we meet each where they are. We teach them the skills necessary to return to their Mainstream school with the skills to succeed

#### Our entry

Every morning and afternoon all students are greeted and sent off with the full staff present







Students still receive their standards based education at their individual level

- 1. Math
- 2. Reading
- 3. Writing
- 4. Science
- 5. Social Skills
- 6. Recreation Class 2 times per week

With our students ranging in age, grade and ability, every lesson is broken down into 1:1 instruction



Social Skills : Mrs. Reed & Mrs. Roddy

All of our students have complex reasons they came to Brookside, we work with everyone to make sure they have the ability to self advocate, understand their feelings and reach out when they feel overwhelmed





Reading : Mrs. Taylor


Each student is using the curriculum of their mainstream peers, but at a rate they can understand and at their level

Recreation : Mr. Nassif


Students are given the opportunity to stretch their legs, try new games in a positive environment where they learn that even if they don't win they still can have fun.
