Northome partners with Kelliher and Lake of the Woods School Districts to provide experiences for Northome, Lake of the Woods and Kelliher students that allow the students to visit career fairs, businesses, post-secondary institutions and both employ and support a wide variety of job skills and training. These experiences foster positive interactions between the students of the three school districts mentioned. All three of these school districts are considered isolated locations in rural Minnesota with smaller student enrollment nubmbers. This collaboration has been a fantastic avenue for our students to develop positive relationships and build knowledge of racial, ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds other than their own.

We are finding the number of student teachers or practicum teachers has been decreasing and therefore, the number of student teacher and practicum teachers in our school district has been decreasing. We continue to reach out to Bemidji State University and the Red Lake Nation College to inquire about practicum students, but due to the low numbers of post-secondary students and our location, we are running into challenges. We currently have one student teacher set to begin working in our Kindergarten class in January or 2024.
