The audit committee met on October 22nd for an update on the delay in the release of the Final 2025 Compliance Supplement for Federal single audits. The Federal Government shutdown has impacted the single audit requirement for the federal grants and in response the

Office of the State Auditor is allowing agencies to submit their financial audit and single audit as two separate audit reports. The November 15th deadline for financial audit submission to the State Auditor has been pushed back to January 20, 2026. The Federal single audit submission deadline will be determined once the Compliance Supplement has been released.
