The monthly SLTs are ongoing at each campus. The SLTs drive the action plans, which are created to ensure positive change in student achievement.

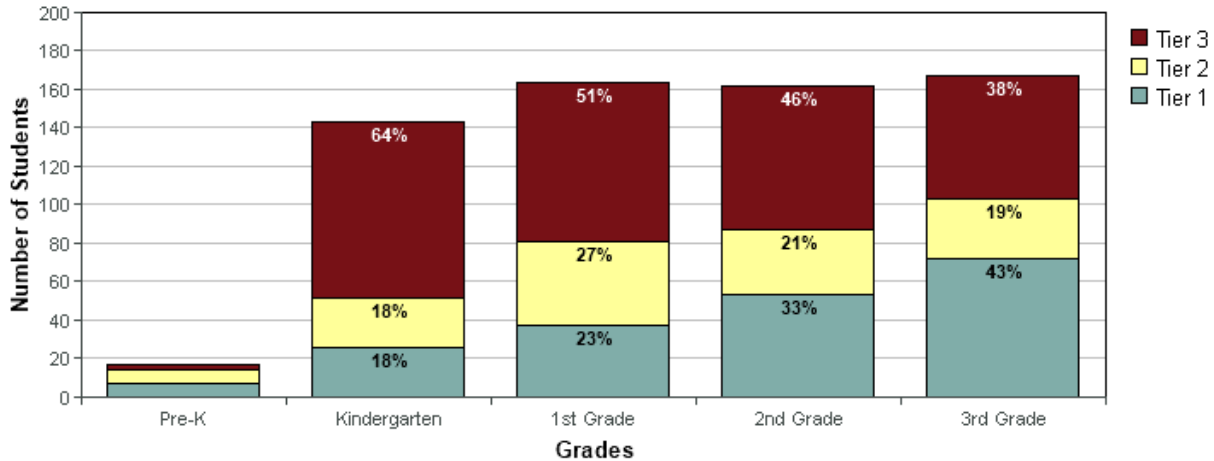
The Test Coordinators will be meeting next week to begin the preparation for the WIDA assessment.

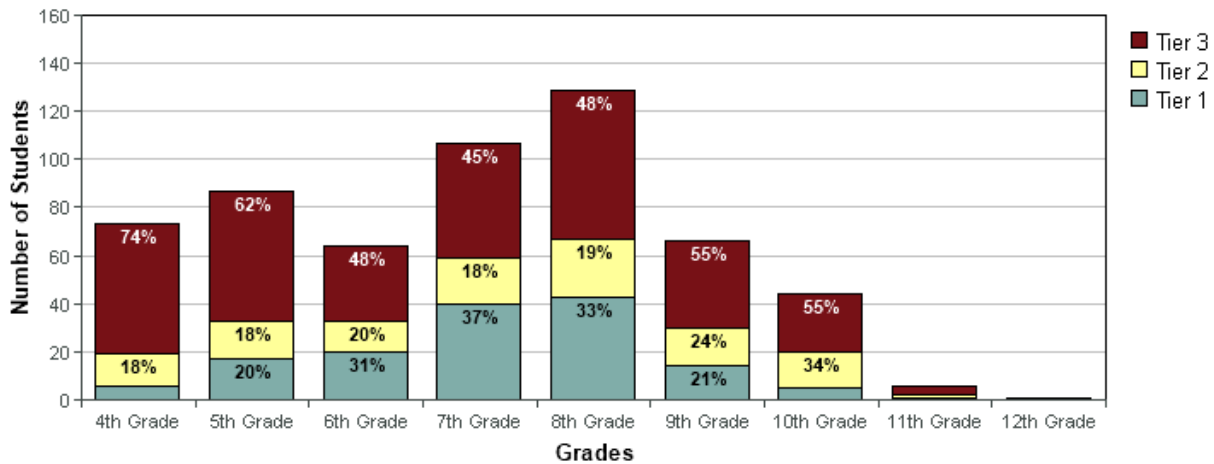
ISIP- Reading/Literacy
