#### Background Information:

- Tarrant County JJAEP services Keller ISD students who are expelled under the mandatory expulsion criteria in Texas Education Code (37.007 (a), (d), and (e)).
- Student placement at JJAEP for mandatory expulsion is reimbursed by the state of Texas through the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission.
- Texas Education Code (37.010(a)) requires every expelled student who is not detained or receiving treatment to be in an educational setting.

#### Administrative Considerations:

- The minimum placement in JJAEP will be 60 successful days of attendance and appropriate behavior.
- The maximum placement will be twelve (12) months for weapons offenses only.
