Each year the Texas Association of School Boards(TASB) honors businesses and organizations for their support and exceptional advocacy of local schools. This state-wide honor, as part of "Stand Up for Texas Public Schools," recognizes local businesses and community organizations who partner with districts, making a difference in the lives of local public-school students.

For more than a decade, the University of North Texas Athletics has hosted more than 20,000 Denton ISD students during various sporting events and touched the lives of even more students through philanthropic efforts. Annually, fourth and fifth graders from local schools are given the opportunity to attend a basketball game at UNT with many experiencing a college athletic event for the first time. Denton ISD students perform the national anthem, participate in halftime games and often get the opportunity to interact with student-athletes from other sports.

In addition, UNT Athletics, in partnership with Conference USA and Michaels, has awarded \$40,000 over four years in giftcards to our fine arts teachers on all grade levels. For many of our teachers, this gift doubles the size of their annual budget and allows them to provide additional supplies directly benefit our students.

Each spring, UNT Athletics partners with our middle schools for the National Girls and Women in Sports Day, bringing female middle school athletes to UNT for workshops and lessons from current college student-athletes. These, and many others, the reason why UNT Athletics was chosen for the December Community Spotlight.
