Melissa Jones (Journalism Instructor)

Full-time Faculty Melissa Jones was named a Center for Community News Champion for 2026 from the University of Vermont's Center for Community News. This award recognizes leadership in building news-academic partnerships. She is one of 150 educators nationwide to win the award. She'll participate in a yearslong training and mentorship program that recognizes college journalists reporting stories for communities, addressing the crisis in local news.

Communications

FTF Kerrie Hughes, Lucas Hahn, Alyssa Sambor helped lead the 2025 Ireland study trip, which involved 36 participants and provided students with an immersive international experience that significantly increased their cultural awareness and sensitivity. Through academic visits, community engagement, and exposure to Ireland's history, culture, and contemporary society, students gained a deeper understanding of global perspectives beyond the classroom. Participants reported strengthened adaptability, improved cross-cultural communication skills, and a greater appreciation for cultural differences. Overall, the trip supported meaningful personal and academic growth, with students returning more globally minded and reflective about their role in an interconnected world.
