

Comprehensive Needs Assessment – Student Achievement

For the 2014 – 2015 school year, Aledo ISD, Coder Elementary, Stuard Elementary, McCall Elementary, Vandagriff Elementary, McAnally Intermediate, Aledo Middle School, Daniel Ninth Grade Campus, and Aledo High School received an accountability rating of “Met Standard” from TEA. Of the schools rated “Met Standard,” the following schools earned one or more academic distinction designations; Aledo High School received Academic Achievement in Science. Daniel Ninth Grade Campus received Academic Achievement in Reading/ELA and Math, Top 25 Percent Student Progress, and Post-Secondary Readiness. McAnally Intermediate received Post-Secondary Readiness.
