
Projected Enrollment Summary: 2025–2026 School Year

The Ionia County Career Center is seeing exceptionally high demand for the 2025–2026 school year. As of March 12, 2025, 391 of the 416 available seats have been filled, representing a 93.99% utilization rate. This strong early enrollment highlights the growing recognition of the Career Center's high-quality programming and the continued importance of career and technical education across our county. This year's enrollment period was marked by slot wars, as districts and counselors moved quickly to secure placements for students in the most sought-after programs. Six of our ten programs—Construction Technology, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts, Diesel Technology, Machine Tool, and Plant/Animal Science—reached 100% capacity almost immediately, resulting in a combined waitlist of 114 students. The largest waitlists were in Machine Tool (28 students), Culinary Arts (25), and Criminal Justice (19). Several additional programs are nearing capacity, including Educational Careers at 93.75% filled, Computer Programming at 90.63%, and Healthcare Foundations at 86.36%. The only program with notable room remaining is Health Occupations, which currently sits at 68.18%

enrollment. These figures reflect strong student interest in the Career Center's continued role in preparing students for meaningful post-secondary pathways.
