

Wilton explained to the students, especially the girls about giving a praise holler after each name was given. Robert Hall logged all names, and wrote them in Blackfeet.








2nd Grade STAR Math for March

Since September, second grade has increased proficient by 12% and decreased intensive by 16%.




3rd Grade STAR Math for March

Each year we are making proficiency growth on the end-of-year-summative SBAC assessment that is given in April. This year our proficiency goal is to go from 13% to 23% proficient in math. One thing we have been doing to increase SBAC scores is using the SBAC interims.

Preparing for SBAC


The 3rd grade team has been preparing students for the state SBAC test using SBAC interims since December. The team has been giving SBAC interim assessment blocks to assess students' progress/understanding of specific math domains. This is our first year using the SBAC interims and they have been a game changer for the teachers because it informs teachers of how to adjust instruction, reteach for mastery, and what specific students are needing assistance. They have also been helpful for teachers to model how to use SBAC tools in the program or how to complete a performance task. For students, it helps them feel more confident of what they will expect to see for the summative test in April.

The 3rd grade team took SBAC interims on their four critical areas (Operations & Algebraic thinking, Fractions, Measurement and Geometry) more than once this year.

Operations and Algebraic Thinking




SBAC Interim - Fractions
