Spring Activities

- All-Conference Spring Athletes;
 - Baseball – Junior Jacob Androli was named to the Gopher Conference All-Conference Team, junior Brendan Snedrud was named Honorable Mention and Noah Lanham was the Gopher Conference Sportsmanship winner.
 - Softball – Senior Robynn Schwichtenberg was selected to the Gopher Conference All-Conference team. Sophomore pitcher Alix Velzke was Honorable Mention All-Conference and senior Kaedyn Judd was the Sportsmanship winner.
 - Girls Track - Congratulations to junior Addison Condon on qualifying for the State Class A Track meet in the Long Jump and Triple jump along with running the final leg of the 4X100 m Relay! Congratulations to Senior Ashlyn Pelant for participating in the Class A State Track meet in the Shot Put, where she capped fantastic high school career with a 5th place finish.
