

- This helps them practice skills at their own level as they work toward grade level proficiency and beyond.

Student Showcase

- In Kindergarten, we do our whole group lesson.
 Then we do math centers for about 25/30 minutes.
- Students are placed into small center groups (up to 4 students). They rotate through each centers every 6-10 minutes.
- It is shorter in the beginning of the year, and longer towards the end of the year. We want to build stamina with working together and using the toys correctly.







What It Means to Feel Safe



- Feeling comfortable and wanting to come to school
- Knowing what to do during drills
- Trusting adults and safety systems
- Feeling safe with teachers and classmates
- Everyone following the rules

When Students Feel Less Safe



- Not knowing about drills ahead of time
- Seeing someone get hurt or emergency vehicles
- Bullying situations
- Crowded or noisy areas (gym, lunch, bus)

How to Help Each Other Feel Safe



- Play with others and show kindness
- Be a buddy to new students
- Help and include others
- Split groups (big kids & little kids)
- Assign bus seats to reduce noise and arguments
