Information: Within two months of this date, the Board is required to hold a public

meeting to discuss the ratings.

The district received a rating of A for 2024-2025 under Texas' School FIRST financial accountability rating system. The rating system measures the quality of a school district's financial management and reporting system. This is the 20th year of School FIRST (Financial Accountability Rating System of Texas), a financial accountability system for Texas school districts developed by the Texas Education Agency in response to Senate Bill 875 of the 76th Texas Legislature in 1999 and amendments under House Bill 5, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013.

The primary goal of School FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of school districts' financial resources, a goal made more significant due to the complexity of accounting associated with Texas' school finance system.

Beginning in 2015-16 the Texas Education Agency began assigning one of four financial accountability ratings to Texas school districts, with the highest being "A" for "Superior Achievement," followed by "B" for "Above-Standard Achievement," "C" for "Standard Achievement" and "F" for "Substandard Achievement." The District has received an "A" rating in nine out of the ten years of this rating system. The district received a "B" rating in the 2022-23 year due to the issuance of the 2021 Bonds in combination with the slowed student enrollment caused due to Covid restrictions.
