Financial Aid 101

The cost of college can seem daunting for parents and students. However, most students receive some kind of financial aid to help pay for the cost of their education.

Financial aid is money to help pay for college. There are four types:

- Scholarships: Money for college given by businesses. organizations, or universities to students with good grades, athletic ability, community service or other unique qualities.
- Grants: Money for college from the federal and state government or the college that your student plans to attend that does not need to be repaid.

Loans: Money borrowed for college that must be paid back.

Work-Study: Part-time jobs, often on campus, that will pay your student for his/her work.

PARENT TIPS: Set up a college savings plan.

It's never too early or late to start a college savings plan.

Talk with your local bank or credit union about set ting up a 529 Savings Plan which will generate interest tax-free for your student's education.

COLLEGE MYTHS – AND REALITIES

MYTH: Only the very best students receive financial aid from colleges.

REALITY: If you are admitted and have financial need, colleges generally want to make it possible for you to attend. In fact, the greatest proportion of financial assistance at private colleges tends to go to students in the middle of the class. High-ability students or students with special talents may receive "merit-based scholarships."

Your friend, the FAFSA

In order for your student to be eligible for grants, loans and workstudy jobs, you must fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) the school year prior to your student attending college. If your student is a senior in high school, this means you! Federal financial aid is given out on a first-come, first-serve basis so it is important to **fill out the FAFSA as early as possible**, as close to January 1 as you can. You don't even have to wait to file your tax return – just estimate the previous year's income and update the information later! File online whenever possible – it will take just 3-5 days, instead of 2-3 weeks by mail.

By filling out the FAFSA, your student will also be eligible for an Oregon Opportunity Grant, which is worth up to \$1,950 in 2012-2013. You will have to fill out a FAFSA each year your student is in college.

Is your student not a senior in high school yet? You can still fill out the FAFSA4Caster which will give you an idea of the amount of financial aid your student can expect to receive – and make the process easier in the future! Get started today at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>.

Hope you had a wonderful Holiday!


We are going to have a guest speaker at our February PTO meeting. Andy Goldner is coming to discuss College Prep.

ATTENTION PARENTS OF 7TH GRADERS

Oregon Law added new requirements for immunizations as of the 2010/2011 school year. All 7th graders who have not met the requirement need to have one additional vaccine or an appropriate medical or religious exemption. Please check your child's records to be sure he/she has the following:

Tdap Vaccine – 1 dose

Tdap offers protection against three serious diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (whooping cough). The Tdap vaccine is given to adolescents and adults 10-64 years old. It is different from the DTaP, which is given to children younger than 7 years. Your student will need one dose of Tdap if it has been at least five years since receiving their last Tetanus containing vaccine. If your student does not have the Tdap shot, contact your child's doctor or call the Josephine County Health Department (541) 474-5353 to make an appointment.

It is important to get an early start on updating your child's immunization information. All updated information should be sent to Fleming Middle School. If you have any questions you can call (541) 476-8284 and talk to Maria at Fleming.
