Labeling

<u>Please</u> make sure that your child's backpack, lunch box, and jackets are all labeled with their first and last name.

Snacks

Please send your child to school with two healthy snacks. Snacks should not include candy, soda or desserts. Thank you for helping keep their bellies full!

Lunch

Lunch is provided free of charge for all Madrona students. I suggest that you visit the Three Rivers School District's website to look at the lunch options for the week in case the options are not to their liking. If you choose to send your child to school with a lunch, please make sure it is labeled. Staff do not have access to a refrigerator or microwave. We appreciate your support with this.

Water Bottles

Library





*We did some Math and Phonics practice, and got acquainted with our school and classroom routines.

*We also completed our first DIBELS
Reading and Acadience Math testing,
which will help determine what
supports students need to grow their
Reading and Math skills.

This week we will practice signing into Chromebooks with our usernames and passwords, begin digging deeper in to our academic learning and take our STAR Reading and Math assessments to give us additional information about student learning needs.

Homework this week consists of practicing our weekly spelling list, practicing our "counting on" Math skill, and reading at home and beginning the September *monthly reading log* attached to this letter. Please post your child's reading log in a place where it is visible and accessible to use regularly. Reading at home can look different for different students. For those who are in the beginning stages of reading, students may be read to/with by an adult or older sibling. For those who can read independently, students may read aloud to an adult, or silently to themselves. Our goal is for students to <u>read at least an hour each week at</u> home--or about 15 minutes, four days a week. Your support, through reminders and/or listening and/or reading with your child, is very important. Thank you for this valuable contribution to your child's learning.

- Reading-Identify the Main Idea and Details of a Story. Determine Character Traits of main characters, & identify Antonyms, (opposite), ex: hot = cold
- Science-Weather & The Water Cycle and its impact.

HOMEWORK POLICY: Students are asked to read <u>20 minutes every night</u>, record their time, and have a parent sign for full credit. They also need to choose one book to answer the comprehension questions in complete sentences (back page). Language Arts/Math homework is expected only if a student does not complete their classwork that day. These assignments are due the following morning they were assigned.

Students will have a spelling test every other Thursday (Next Spelling Test: Thursday, September 14th). They can study their spelling & vocabulary words any way they choose, in addition to completing the attached practice pages.

CURRENT FOCUS: In ELA students are asking the essential question "How do Friends Help Each Other?" in our anchor text "Winn Dixie." Out Target Skill/Strategies are: Point of View, Summarizing, and prefixes (re/un/dis). In math, students will be using models and strategies to show their understanding of place value (recognizing that each digit is ten times the value of the digit to the right).
