CES Needle Safety Presentations

- In preparation of the CES's participation with Community Clean Up Week, the CES hosted Needle Safety Presentations on Thursday, May 5th.
- Trish Conatser, RN, and Tsai with EMS volunteered their time to provide 6-needle safety presentations from K-5th grade (20-minutes each) in individual elementary classrooms. The elementary teachers & I were grateful for Trish & Tsai's time as well as their support with our elementary initiative.

CMS Field Day

- The CMS Staff desired to create a memorable middle school experience for our students prior to the end of the school year. With that said, the CMS hosted a CMS Field Day with parent/guardian permission on Friday, May 6th.
- Field day activities were designed to support the whole child, encourage active lifestyle, and promote cooperative skills within our students. Additionally, since our CMS Field Day was considered part of our CMS Program and held during the regular school hours, regular school attendance was required.

CES Sea Week

- As per our CES Sea Week Guidelines Packet:
 - CES K-5th Grade Students participate in an annual school-wide thematic learning event focused on our local Southeast Alaska marine environment every May. This is an effective way to engage students in Science-Technology-Engineering-Math (STEM) Education and other cross-disciplinary learning in both indoor and outdoor settings. Teachers can creatively utilize a variety of resources to craft unique and meaningful learning experiences tailored to the students in their classes while utilizing real-world contexts for standards-based teaching and learning. This is also a great opportunity to teach students about stewardship and ocean sustainability.
- The CES has designated the week of May 16th-20th as CES Sea Week this year. Individual classroom teachers stay in close contact with the parents/guardians of their students and schedule beach field trips with permission. CES Teachers always begin their CES Sea Week activities with a review of beach etiquette, in which Ms. Melissa Peavey is available to support teachers as they cover this topic with their students.

CEMS Orientations & Step Up Days

- Kindergarten Orientation was held on Sunday, May 15th at 4pm in Mr. Frieb's classroom. Thirteen (13) kindergarteners are projected next school year. From that 13, nine (9) attended the orientation with their parent/guardian on May 15th.
