Regular Board Meeting (Draft)

Thursday, September 29, 2016 @ 5:00 p.m. Babb Elementary School

The meeting convened with Babb Elementary staff, student, parent recognitions and presentations at 12:09 p.m. There was no quorum. Board members present: Wendy Bremner-Chair and Steve Conway.

Billie Jo Juneau, Principal, introduced teachers Jennifer Fenner and Jo Ray Wilcox. Students gave presentations on the culture and traditions of the Blackfeet. Grades K-2 presented the parfleche bags they made, what they are used for, and the meaning of the designs on the bags. Grades 3-6 talked about their family trees and family values.

Student Recognitions: Ms. Juneau recognized Jude Juneau and Teagan Walker for being on the honor roll and scoring proficient in math during the 2015-2016 school year. Karson Loring, Kendall Loring and Jude Juneau were commended for having perfect attendance for the school year.

Parent Recognition: Ms. Juneau recognized the following parents for their support as volunteers for all school events: Shelly Flamand, April Hipp, Mary Ann Flamand, Traci Vaile, Leatha Arcand, Caroline Gray, Kim Walker, Dennis Juneau, Gary and Sam Blackmore, Shantel DuBray, Starla Cassidy, Doug and Tristan Fitzgerald.

Staff Recognitions: Ms. Juneau commended Jennifer Fenner and Suzanne Weekes for going above and beyond and doing everything they can to benefit their students.

Presentations: Jennifer Fenner, grades K-2 teacher, reviewed Star Reading scores at 80% or above in 2015-2016; dealing with poor student behavior every day; using ISIP which teaches the skills specific to what the teacher is using. Jo Wilcox, grades 3-6 teacher, discussed the large span in percentiles in reading and requested information for grading students at low levels. Jercy Matt stated that the students must be reported at their actual grade level to show actual growth and also stated that Babb School is a SFA school and should be requesting supplies and materials to be teaching SFA. The Babb school received chromebooks and headsets that were donated for the students to use. Staff felt that Carlene Salois, Special Education, is an asset to the Babb school. Ms. Fenner's class has 17 students and Ms. Wilcox has 13 students. Presentations concluded at 2:00 p.m.

Ms. Bremner called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Public Comment: Billie Jo Juneau stated that during the pow wow they could not find a Blackfeet flag and recommended that all schools have flag in their buildings. Jercy Matt let the school board and administration know that Loren Gobert is a local business that offers window tinting and graphics painting. Mr. Gobert is interested in working with the school district. He can offer logos on buses, signs, and many other items.

Staff Recognition: Corrina Hall recognized staff from KW Bergan and Vina Chattin. Ms. Hall stated that each of the individuals work with a lot of data, they do testing and analysis, walkthroughs, coaching, they are wonder women with their knowledge and very helpful to the school. Brandy Bremner is also a cheerleading coach and Sandi Campbell goes above and beyond in tutoring students. Darcy Skunkcap and Misty Tatsey are Immersion teachers working to acquire knowledge and culture teaching the kids.

John Salois stated that these students have worked during the school activities during school and in the summer. Mr. Hall will be the supervisor. Second by Mr. Evans. No public participation. Board discussion: Mr. Evans asked if Jason Respondek has an increase due to moving in just hours. It was explained that Mr. Respondek moved on the salary schedule because of having a Masters. Mr. Conway asked why the MOA with tribal health is including East Glacier. Mr. Rouse stated that they want to increase the range of people they serve and this will open it to a larger group. There apply to Medicaid and there is no cost to the district. Mr. Evans requested more information on the transportation request for Cut Bank. Wayne Hall stated that these are kids that live in our school district but go to school in Cut Bank. If Browning Schools did not support these contracts, the Cut Bank bus would have to wait at Wellmans to pick up our students. Some of these students live far out north of Cut Bank and BPS cannot get to them as we do not run a bus route out that far. There are more students going to Cut Bank this year. BPS does the same with Heart Butte. Mr. Hall stated that BPS has to look at the large area we serve and the timeframe it would take to hall all of these students. The district is reimbursed by OPI based per mile, not on how many kids we haul. The district is purchasing larger buses and looking at cost, size, maintenance, fuel costs, etc., and is now using propane which is more cost efficient. The Transportation Dept stays in touch with OPI daily

as mileage and routes are very precise. No further discussion. Motion carried 6-2 with Mr. Conway and Mr. Evans opposed to approve TR-4 Individual Transportation Contracts for Cut Bank Schools 2016-2017.

Motion by Mr. Evans to adjourn at 5:36 p.m. Second by Mr. Conway. Motion carried.
