Special Education Team Strengthens Early Childhood Transitions Through Regional Collaboration

On Friday, January 30, Unity's Special Education Director, Elizabeth Jorgensen, Early Childhood teachers Stephanie Crawford and Amanda Siefert, School Psychologist, Nicole Kovar, and Elementary Principal, Bill Dewitt, will participate in a CESA 11 regional collaboration session focused on supporting young children as they transition into public schools. This half-day event brings together school districts, Head Start programs, County Birth to Three teams, and regional service providers to share successes, address challenges, and discuss best practices for early childhood transitions. Topics include family engagement, transition planning, compliance requirements, and regional needs. Participants will also collaborate directly with county Birth to Three teams to review and update the Interagency Transition Agreement, an important requirement that helps ensure coordinated, family-centered support for children entering school. Unity's participation reflects an ongoing commitment to strong partnerships and smooth transitions for young learners and their families.

Introducing Amanda Siefert and Enhancing Elementary Student Support



Unity Elementary is committed to high-quality, personalized special education services. To better support the growing number of students, we are making some staffing updates that will strengthen our team and enhance student learning. We are thrilled to introduce Amanda Siefert, our newest special education teacher. Amanda brings 17 years of experience supporting children and individuals with diverse needs. She has worked in healthcare and educational programs, including leadership roles at Unity's Eagle Care Club and LEAP Childcare Center. As part of these staffing additions, mid-year adjustments to special education case manager assignments took effect on January 6, 2026. These adjustments ensure each student continues to receive personalized support tailored to their needs. Unity Elementary's current special education teachers—Stephanie Crawford, Sophie Peterson, Sara Mattson, and Lori Anderson—will continue in their roles, though some adjustments to their caseloads will occur. We are excited about these updates and confident they will support the success and growth of all students!

Welcoming New Educational Assistants

Unity has welcomed six educational assistants to the Special Education Department since the beginning of the 2025-26 school year.
