VACTE LAW ENFORCEMENT AND PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAM

The VACTE Law Enforcement and Public Safety Program introduces and trains students in skills necessary to pursue a career in Law Enforcement and Emergency Telecommunications. This course covers instruction and hands-on practice in law enforcement history and theory, operational command leadership, administration of public police organizations, labor relations, incident response strategies, legal and regulatory responsibilities, prison guard and dispatch skills in police and emergency management services. Practice in real-life situations related to dispatch and law situations are incorporated.

Our students receive up to 18 credit hours towards a Criminal Justice major.
Upon completion, students will have opportunity to test for certification in
APCO-Public Safety Telecommunication Dispatcher and Arizona Dept. of
Public Safety-Security Guard. Second year students have extensive training in
911 Dispatch and will be eligible for entry level Law Enforcement jobs.

The instructor, Jennifer Choate, is a retired police officer from Utah. She brings many years of Law Enforcement experience to the classroom while enhancing the class with demonstrations from current and past Law Enforcement programs. The Cottonwood Police Department had their K9 officers meet with our students and provided hands-on instruction and live demonstrations displaying the skills and training of our police K9s. Our second-year students are working with Cottonwood Dispatch doing 911 internships. They toured several law enforcement facilities to gain knowledge of the different jobs in this field. Among them was Yavapai County Jail, where they got a firsthand look at careers in corrections, law enforcement and public safety. Local law enforcement officers have helped with firearm safety instruction followed by hands-on training at the range. The Cottonwood SWAT officers helped teach our students the basic functions of the SWAT team. The amazing classroom lectures and direct experiences are helping our students prepare to go into the Law Enforcement & Public Safety field.

The VACTE Law Enforcement & Public Safety class has helped give back to our community in so many ways. Students walked with local firefighters and the community in remembrance of 9/11 and the 411 first responders, who ran toward danger when others ran away. They volunteer at Manzanita Outreach and several help with the "Shop with a Cop" program and are touched by how it helps young kids. They partner with MADD for the 5K Walk to help educate the public on drinking and driving. Giving back to the community is a large part of this class and our students are becoming better citizens for it.

All Law Enforcement students are members of SkillsUSA and compete in Regional, State and National competitions. They also have opportunity to serve as delegates at the National Convention. Past students become role models and mentors to our new students, and many are already working in the field.

We are so proud of their accomplishments.


