Introduction

English learners (ELs), also called multilingual learners or multilinguals, are students whose proficiency in speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English may hamper their ability to successfully achieve in an English speaking classroom. ELs and their families come from diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds, and the vast majority of Meridian's EL students come from Spanish speaking homes.

A teacher with an ESL PK-12 endorsement is qualified to teach ESL classes within the grade range of the PEL. For example, an individual who holds a PEL endorsed in elementary education 1-6 and an ESL PK-12 endorsement may only teach ESL in the elementary grades 1-6.

Background

We have 7 teachers in the district with ESL teaching certification. Megan Zamora is our designated ESL teacher, however, she also teaches Spanish at the high school for half of her time. The other certified staff are currently serving in other roles.

Student Population

Meridian's EL population has increased over the past eight years and seems to be maintaining larger numbers of students throughout the district.

Prior Staffing vs Current

In the 2016-2017 SY, there were 3 certified ESL teachers employed by Meridian. After two of those teachers left the district, they were not replaced, and only one itinerant ESL teacher is currently employed (Ms. Zamora).

Legal Requirements

Based on requirements for providing services for ELs, any school with a population larger than 20 students with the same home language must offer instruction in that language as well as English language support. This year, we are very close to this threshold at the high school. The new Spanish for Spanish-speakers course would meet the requirement for those students who are enrolled. However, additional staff would be necessary to appropriately meet the needs of ELs in the district.
