• Program History

- ESD began 13 years ago in 2002 with one program at EP Rayzor
- After-school care was taken over by DISD from the City of Denton

• Program Growth

- From one elementary school to all 22 elementary schools within DISD
- We now serve well over 3000 students each school year
- We employee over 100 college students each school year
 - The vast majority of these students are enrolled in Teacher Education programs at the local universities.
 - We are growing our teachers. These students are gaining invaluable experience working with students, parents, and school staff.
 - We are planning summer programs and middle school program for the 2015-2016 school year.

• Tuition and Scholarships

- We make every effort possible to work with all families.
- We have made 33 parent tuition arrangements this school year.
- Scholarships are awarded to families that demonstrate a significant financial need.
- 2015-2016 Registration
 - 2015-2016 early program registration will be fully online (April 20-25)
 - Parents will pay their registration fee and complete all of the required paperwork at the same time.
 - This will alleviate many of the problems encountered at previous registrations such as:
 - Camping out
 - Long wait times
 - No shows due to busy schedules

• UNT/TWU Partnerships

• The program partners with local universities to enrich the students' experience in the program.

- Developing a math program with UNT
- UNT Fraternity, Alpha Chi, will be hosting a literacy event at Pecan Creek in March
- Program Coordinators work with UNT Career Center to promote employment with our program to future educators
