

Student Enrollment and Participation Overview




- 2024-2025 PEIMS Summer Collection: **7,096** Emergent Bilingual students
- 1 out of every 5 students is an Emergent Bilingual
- 488 students reclassified at the end of the 2024-2025 school year
- Hodge Elementary: 54% EB
- Strickland Middle School: 28% EB
- Ryan High School: **22**% EB


Top Languages of EB Students

students


Spanish	6,053 (80.46%)

42 Other Languages	860 (5.72%)








Program Participation
