Highlights from 2024-2025

- 59- 8th grade students earned a high school credit for Algebra 1 last year
- 110 students participated in Track, both 7th and 8th grade boys and girls won the Sagebrush League Championships
- We held our 1st Career Fair with 27 community vendors and 288 8th grade Students participating
- We ran school wide PBIS quarterly reward events and school assemblies
- We ran our 2nd annual Night of the Arts for our Culinary, Art, and Performing Arts (Band and Choir) students to display their talents.
- We have afterschool clubs- Drama, Gamers, Pokémon, D&D, Journalism, fishing, and Homework Club/Tutoring
- We improved our Chronic Absentee rate from 41% to 38%.
- We improved our Tardy rate from 17% to 14%.

Silverland Middle School Continuous Improvement Plan Summary for 2025-2026

Goal 1- Lyon County School District will increase the total number of K-12 work-based learning opportunities provided to all students by 10% from the 2024/2025 school year to the 2025/2026 school year.

Goal 2- Lyon County School District will increase the total number of students participating in K-12 work based learning opportunities by 10% from the 2024/2025 school year to the 2025/2026 school year.

Goal 3- In grades K-8, at least 58% of students in Lyon County School District will meet or exceed their personal typical growth in math and reading from the Beginning of Year assessment to the End of the year assessment iReady assessment during the 2025/2026 school year.

Goal 4-By the end of the 2025/2026 school year, 100% of instructional staff will participate in at least two professional learning cycles focused on Tier 1 and Tier2 instructional practices. Progress will be measured through training attendance logs (Character Strong, SchoolLinks, iReady, MTSS trainings), weekly MTSS meeting documentation, and intervention rosters demonstrating data-informed action steps.

Goal 5- Lyon County School District will reduce the chronic absenteeism rate by 10%from the 2024/2025 school year to the 2025/2026 school year.
