Building Update

BMS Staff worked the entire month of February remotely and will begin coming into the building March 1st!

Most areas in both the "old" portion and the "new" portion of the building are complete. A final walkthrough with a "punch-list" still needs to be performed, but there are still many areas where finish work is still needed. The new addition is still not 100% wifi capable.

We are waiting on cupboards and countertops in BJA, and seating for the FACS, Art and BJA areas (crescent tables and chairs).

The weight room and fitness area will have the equipment moved from the bus garage once the final punch list is completed. The new gym received a new coat of sealant on the floor, and three additional rows of seating of the bleachers still need to be installed. The cafeteria floor has been waxed/sealed the floor and it is a beautiful area!

The new kitchen is complete and is being used to prepare sack lunches for distribution to the students. Our kitchen is beautiful! If you haven't had a chance to see it, I'd be happy to give you a tour.

New COVID19 signage for spacing, no social gathering, direction flow in the hallways, and cleaning/sanitizing reminders in the bathroom have arrived and are being placed throughout the building.

Staff were recently given the opportunity to use a second (used) monitor to help teach their classes. Sixteen staff members requested the monitors and the initial reports are that they love them!



On February 23rd and 24th, BMS students and families were invited via Face Book and Infinite Campus to come to campus and pickup backpacks containing school supplies and boxes of food. Families were met at their vehicles outside the building by our TA's who delivered food and backpacks to them. A total of 216 families came in and received food, while over 270 backpacks/supplies were distributed over the course of those two days! A give-a-way is being planned every two weeks.
