Mr. Babcock presented on several items. He recognized Tigers of the Month. Recapped the latest enrichment day. Choir students went to Luther for a contest. The music group took a trip to Nashville over spring break. Level three and four Spanish students have been working with Kindergartners. The small engines teams placed 1<sup>st</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Carlson presented on several items. He thanked the staff for family reading night that had around 80 students attend. Steele Waseca Coop and Bakhen Museum reps will visit 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders to talk about career paths in electricity and science. February was I Love to Read Month. 91% of elementary families attended conferences.

Mr. Werk presented a recap on the winter sports season. Wrestling had six state qualifiers and one state champion. Award winners for Wrestling, Girls Basketball, and Boys Basketball were presented. One Act Play finished 1<sup>st</sup> in the sub-section and 4<sup>th</sup> in the section. Spring sports started last week and numbers seem to be up.

Ms. Schmidt provided an update on testing throughout the school year. 26 students wrapped up English Learner testing. Next week is the Seal of Biliteracy for English Learner students. 42 students signed up for the ACTs. MCAs will be in April and May and teachers have been prepping students for them.

These potential projects included: a technology purchase to replace old devices, new math curriculum, kitchen equipment with food service money that is required to be spent down, tile for drainage and asphalt projects.
