




The mission of Communities In Schools of North Texas is to surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life.



ACE AFTERSCHOOL 21ST CENTURY GRANT



- Provides 3 hours of out of school time support at each campus per day
- Operates 5 days a week, for 29 weeks
 Fall-Spring and 5 weeks in Summer
- Includes busing transportation home for students after the program
- Includes daily snack and dinner through partnership with ARAMARK
- Activities focus on: Homework help,
 Academic Enrichment, School
 Engagement, Parent and Family
 Engagement, and Enrichment
 Opportunities.

2024-2025: PROGRESS TO DATE

> 2,234 students receiving 36,361 case mangement service hours. 303 students participating in afterschool programs.

> 385 mentors and community volunteers deployed to campuses.

- 218 students receiving 15 additional hours of high impact tutoring.
- 93 students receiving additional mental and behavioral health services through licensed professionals.



Students at Peters Colony Elementary School participate in CISNT Leadership Groups. Through the Rise Up Girls and Guys Who Rise, students hear from local leaders in the community about leadership skills

and positive character traits.
Through engaging activities students are equipped with the skills needed to problem solve, communicate clearly and build their confidence to stand up to peer pressure.
