


Congratulations to the Neah-Kah-Nie FBLA Student Organization -Future Business Leaders of America – who had 19 national qualifiers at the annual Oregon state competition, which took place in Portland, Oregon April 5-7, 2018. The team composed of 29 students won an overall 22 top 10 state awards with 19 national qualifiers. To be a national qualifier a student, or team of students, must place in the top 4 at state in their event. With over 140 schools participating across the State of Oregon and over 1000 students competing, this was an excellent showing for a small, rural 2A school. Nationals will be held in

The NKN High School Technology Club has three exciting projects we are working on right now.

We continue to work with Mark Balmer on the fundamentals of electronics – building circuits – working with Logic Gates – drawing schematics – writing truth tables. In addition we are working on creating a Makerspace at the high school with 3D printing, soldering, and eventually laser cutting. The goal is to give students a strong foundation in electronics and engineering.

NKN HS varsity softball team has three returning seniors: Maddie Lambert, shortstop/pitcher; Esmeralda Ramirez, 2nd base; and, Hannah Grider pitcher/shortstop/3rd base. Both of our senior pitchers have improved and are throwing fairly consistently. Grider provides stability and accuracy in the circle, while Lambert adds speed and the ability to change the pace of a game. Both pitchers have been hitting the ball well this season. Ramirez at 2nd base is great at making the routine plays, adds depth to our batting line-up and has a number of stolen bases on the season.

Returning juniors are Avery Smith center field, Dixie Esplin left field, Alicia Lilly catcher, CC Stewart utility, and Destiny Payne designated hitter/outfield. All of our juniors can hit the ball.
