Messages from the Principal:

Dear Parents:

I want to use this month's letter to highlight our progress on three important initiatives- attendance, technology and mathematics. Each area is important in our effort to help all of our students be successful. We are beginning to see some great results and at the same time recognize some challenges that are still ahead of us.

We stress good school attendance because research shows a strong correlation between attendance and academic growth. We recognize students with perfect attendance every month and work closely with families to help students who are struggling in this area. Our attendance rate is currently 96.79% and almost the highest in the district. We believe this is one of the reasons our students are doing so well.

We are continuing to expand on our use of technology to improve instruction. Our teachers have spent several hours this fall learning how to use document cameras, projectors, laptop computers and the internet to improve the educational experience of our students. Most recently, teachers are learning how to use a wireless student response system that allows the teacher to quickly check an entire classroom for understanding and identify students who may need some extra help.

Finally, we are continuing a major effort to improve math instruction to meet the higher standards being set by the state. All of our teachers are teaching to the new standards using a pacing guide developed by the district. We are learning new ways to increase the amount of active engagement with math by introducing more opportunities to explore the meaning of math problems as students strengthen their math reasoning abilities. The state has given schools a real challenge by increasing the score required to meet the state benchmarks in grades three through eight. The "cut scores" required on the state math assessment have increased by seven points in the third, fourth and fifth grades.

I am impressed by the professionalism and willingness of the Jerome Prairie teaching staff for taking on the training in math and technology this fall. We believe it will lead to better instruction in the classroom. We thank you as parents for supporting our efforts by ensuring that your children are here each day ready to learn, and we thank you for the trust you place in us to do our best for all the children we serve.

STUDENT ABSENCES, TARDIES AND EXCUSES

Daily attendance and punctuality are absolutely necessary for a student to gain maximum benefits from his/her education experience.

Oregon school law supports the District Board's view and restricts excused absences to illness of the student, student medical or dental appointments (confirmation of appointments may be required), illness in the immediate family which requires the student's presence at home, when the tenets of the student's religion require an absence for religious observance of a holiday or emergency situations that require the student's absence. All other absences must meet the approval of the school officials or be treated as unexcused absences. An absence that does not meet the criteria of an excused absence, but has been confirmed by the parent will be marked as a "verified" absence.

Absences will only be excused or verified if a phone call is received from the parent/guardian the day the student is absent or a note received in the school office not more then 3 days after the child returns to school. Getting your student to school on time is also very important. Not only does your student miss the introduction to the day but coming in late interrupts the class and the education of the other students in the classroom. School starts at 7:40 AM. If you child arrives at school late he/she will need to come to the office to get a tardy slip. You need to know that a tardy slip will count against their perfect attendance.

INCLEMENT WEATHER



In the event of adverse weather conditions, please tune into Radio Stations KRWO. KAJO, KLRD, or KBOY. Television Stations KOBI (Channel 5), KDRV (Channel 12), or KTVL (Channel 10) or the Three Rivers School District Web page for information on school closures and bus schedules. With our new SynerVoice system you should be getting a phone call within 15 minutes of the decision to close school in bad weather or a 2 hour delayed start. Therefore it is extremely important that we have your most current phone number so that you can be reached.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel, but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be ran. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations. <u>Remember</u> that Jerome Prairie is in the Hidden Valley Area.

When straight-line routes are run, the affected roads are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel you may bring your child to the nearest intersection or the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.

B13	All roads will be traveled
B14	Midway(south of Jerome Prairie Rd.), Sleepy Hollow Loop, Carrollwood Dr., Neill Rd.
B15	All Roads will be traveled
B16	Riverbanks Rd., Marcy Loop, Dutcher Creek, Dutchy Way, Limpy Creek.

B17 Slate Creek Rd., Round Prairie, Minnow Lane, Firview

OPTIONS:

- 1. School may be delayed by two hours
- 2. School may be closed for the entire day.
- 3. We may operate on a limited bus route as described above.

There may be times that because of weather the school will have to close early in order to get the children home safely. We will make every attempt to notify parents or the emergency number that is on your child's registration form. Please keep the phone number and emergency contacts up to date. Your student needs to know what to do and where to go in case of this sort happens. Children need to be aware of what is expected of them if the need arises.
