Rippleside actions to meet ISD1s goals:

Reading

The K-3 teachers, special education department, and interventions are attending LETRS training for the next 2 years. Select 4-6 grade teachers are attending the MDE Intensifying Tier 1 cohort.

Math

K-6 teachers are following Math Expressions to fidelity to identify and address any curriculum and state standard gaps. Select 4-6 grade teachers are attending the MDE Intensifying Tier 1 cohort.

Science

The K-6 teachers will embed science instruction 60 minutes per week through read alouds, Scholastic magazines, science content, and hands on experiments so that all students will increase vocabulary and content knowledge.

AHS actions to meet ISD1s goals:

Increase tier 2 academic and behavior supports for students. (REACH, MTSS Math, Co-Teaching Math, Co-Teaching 7th grade English, 7/8 literacy intervention, AmeriCorps, structured homerooms)

Use MEIRS guidance to develop focus areas (attendance, behavior, and course performance) for grade level teams to increase student success.

Focus on transition from 6th to 7th grade in reading and math.

Continue with walkthroughs and evaluations to intensify Tier 1 best practices in instruction.
