APRIL 14, 2026

Chair Yang called the work study session to order at 6:04 PM with the following present: Chair Yang, Clerk Livingston, Treasurer Swor, Directors Yener, Nitardy, and Superintendent Tucci Osorio. Arriving at 6:11 PM: Vice-Chair C. Anderson and Director Rosemark.

Others present: Josh Anderson, Director of Finance and Technology, Andy Beaton, Assistant Superintendent; Tricia St. Michaels, Assistant Superintendent; Amy Luckner, Director of Research, Evaluation, and Assessment; and May Her, executive assistant.

J. Anderson reviewed updated January revisions for the 2025-26 budget. He also presented budget assumptions and projections that will be used to drive the 2026-27 budget process.

J. Anderson led a discussion on going out for another referendum in the fall.

Tucci Osorio gave updates on the FY27 general fund and staffing.

St. Michaels reviewed the following 20 policies which are proposed for revision: 410 (Family & Medical Leave); 503 (Student Attendance); 515 (Protection & Privacy of Pupil Records); 530 (Immunization Requirements); 615 (Testing Accommodations, Modifications, and Exemptions for IEPs, Section 504 Plans, and LEP Students); 701 (Establishment and Adoption of School District Budget); 721 (Uniform Grant Guidance Policy Regarding Federal Revenue Sources); 211 (Criminal or Civil Action Against School District, School Board Member, Employee, or Student); 404 (Employment Background Checks); 405 (Veteran's Preference); 406 (Public & Private Personnel Data & Form: Employee Authorization for Release of Information); 418 (Drug Free Workplace/Drug Free School); 420 (Students & Employees with Sexually Transmitted Infections & Diseases); 427 (Workload Limits for Certain Special Education Teachers); 520 (Student Surveys); 604 (Instructional Curriculum); 613 (Graduation Requirements); 616 (School District System Accountability); 618 (Assessment of Student Achievement); and 620 (Credit for Learning). The policies will have a formal reading at the April 28 business meeting, followed by an additional reading and proposed action at the May 19 business meeting.

Luckner reviewed the 2025 graduation data.

During Board check-in, the following items were shared:

- Nitardy enjoyed the extra day she got to spend with C. Anderson at the NSBA conference. She enjoyed the sessions at the conference as well.
- Yener enjoyed the conference and said it felt almost like a board retreat. She attended lots of AI sessions.
