Goal #1

Goal

At least 75% of our students in all grades will meet proficiency standards using mastery connect proficiency scales in all content areas along with students in grades 3-5 meeting proficiency standards on state end of year assessment in all content areas.

Academic Areas

- Reading
- Mathematics
- Writing
- Science

Measurements

We will use this current year's (2015/2016) end of year state assessment data along with mastery connect proficiency data to establish our baseline. Progress will then be tracked using mastery connect proficiency scales and mid-year state assessment. The completed measurements will include mastery connect and the state SAGE assessment.

Action Plan Steps

- 1. Provide additional training, including one professional development day for all teachers and one additional day for new teachers on Professional Learning Communities along with effective teaching practices.
- 2. Purchase I-Pads for K-2 grade teachers to use in reinforcing basic reading and math skills.
- 3. Select and use a school leadership team to guide the implementation of the school plan and grade level PLC team development.
- 4. Purchase and use 'Reading Plus' as a system to intervene and extend the reading ability of our 4th and 5th grade students.
- 5. Purchase and use 'Go Noodle Plus' to provide brain breaks between academic tasks while still focusing on academic content during the school day.
- Purchase and use IXL math and reading for practice and extension of math and reading skills.
- 7. Purchase and use 'Typing Agent' to help teach basic typing skills.
- 8. Send three teachers to Utah Rural Schools Conference to present on intervention systems and learn how we can strengthen our own systems.
- 9. Purchase additional document cameras to replace those that are wearing out.

- 1. Provide small group intervention using paid interventionists.
- 2. Provide one-on one tutoring through the Americorps program using adult volunteers.
- 3. Provide one-on one cross age tutoring through Americorps.
- 4. Provide grade specific and content specific professional development to staff and volunteers.
