Stampeding Towards the Playoffs!

Last year, each of our winter sports teams qualified for OSAA State competition, and this year, from our earlyresults, we may be on our way for the second time!

Wrestling

This season the team is led again by Coach Matt Mettler, and assisted by Stu Burgess, Alan Dole, and Cameron Whipp. Last weekend they placed several wrestlers at the 15-team Sutherlin Invitational, while finishing third overall. Seth Sotelo was first at 130 pounds, Blake Andreasen took 2nd at 145, and Zach Hallmark (103), Alex Dole (119), and Josh Sarot (152) all placed third in their weights.

The wrestlers will host North Valley in a dual meet on Wednesday, February 10th. JV action begins at 5:30, with varsity to follow. Districts will be held this year at Illinois Valley on Saturday, February 20th, with wrestling beginning at 9 am. Please join us there!

Swimming

Coach Robyn Vina is assisted again this year by Mike LaRue in leading our swimmers through Special District competition and hopefully on to state.

Last Saturday, at SOU several of our swimmers placed while competing against the Skyline Conference teams. The men's 200 Medley Relay and 200 and 400 Freestyle Relay teams placed 2nd, Clint Wallace 2nd in the 100 Butterfly, and Billy Willing 3rd in the 100 Freestyle. For the women, Chloe Wilson was 2nd in the 50 Freestyle and 100 Backstroke, and Nina Washburn was 3rd in the 100 Freestyle.

Districts will be hosted by North Bend High School in Coos Bay, Friday and Saturday, February 12 and 13.

Men's Basketball (12-5, 4-1)

Coach Jackson's men's basketball team is currently ranked 6th in the Coaches' Poll, leading the Skyline Conference after one-plus rounds out of the three. A key 50-42 win at Henley last Friday put us into a twoway tie with Phoenix.

The Skyline Conference title may well come down to the last game of the season, Friday, February 19th here at home against Phoenix. Be sure to join us for that night, which will also be Senior Night, for an exciting final conference matchup.

Women's Basketball (12-4, 5-0)

The Lady 'Stangs are currently undefeated in Skyline Conference play, and ranked 8th in the latest Coaches' Poll. With the third-ranked defense in the State, Coach Kennedy's team has taken the first two conference matchups from Henley, placing themselves in first place as we approach the halfway mark.

Reaching their fourth consecutive Skyline title will not be easy, as their last five games will be on the road. Please join us for Senior Night, and our last home game Tuesday, Feb. 2nd.

Trimester Eligibility

Just a quick note to remind student-athletes and parents that the new requirements to be athletically eligible are found in the Student Handbook. In brief, a student must be passing 4 classes to be considered eligible by the OSAA, and making adequate progress towards graduation. Further, students must have a 2.0 GPA based upon the previous trimester's grades.

2009/2010 ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Straight Line Routes For:

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.
