Child Advocacy Centers are community-base facilities which use a multi-disciplinary approach to reduce trauma to child victims of physical abuse, sexual abuse, or neglect. Collaboration exists between medical, mental health, prosecutorial, child protective services and law enforcement professional in a effort to serve the best interest of the child. All services offered at CAC are free of charge to the child victim and a non-offending caregivers.

What service(s) does your non-profit/community organization provide? *

CACs provide forensic interviews, medical exams by Sexual Abuse Nurse Examiners, Mental Health therapy, advocacy for child and/or family, and prevention education.

Each CAC has different needs. Activities can include facility improvements, snack or gas card donations, donations of new blankets or stuffed animals for child victims, event volunteers.
