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Josh Robinson Superintendent	<ul> <li>We continue to explore applicable grant opportunities for the district. The Stronger Connections Grant is a competitive grant that focuses on developing and supporting Equitable Multi-Level Systems of Support (EMLSS). Receiving the grant would help support the implementation of our developing EMLSS plan. Two other competitive grant possibilities include the 21st Century Community Learning Center and Public Charter Schools.</li> <li>Lisa Jensen and I provided a Roots and Branches presentation to the Lakeland Conference Superintendents. Many districts who haven't already implemented a childcare center are considering it. Those that do have one in place contribute to a positive network of support for each other.</li> <li>To specifically address our district's core values of inclusivity, positive character, and global citizenship, we have purchased in-district CESA consultant days to help us design a sustainable plan that implements staff training and student engagement strategies related to the three values.</li> </ul>

This time is at the end of the day and provides flexible scheduling to students who need extra help in a specific class. Currently, teachers are able to request specific students to visit them during Viking Time. We use a google spreadsheet to share information between staff members to help staff keep track of students during this flexible scheduling option. We are hoping to create a way for students to track their own flexible schedule, therefore increasing their ability to be self directed learners. Ultimately we would like students to be in charge of themselves and their learning, and determine their own needs to be successful.</li> <li>The Veterans day program was Friday, November 10th.
