The school district is committed to providing a safe and productive learning environment for all students. To achieve this goal, we have a comprehensive student code of conduct that outlines behavioral expectations and potential disciplinary actions for violations.

It is important to understand that disciplinary actions will be administered in a manner that is **fair**, **consistent**, **and appropriate to the specific behavior and its context**. This means that the consequences for misconduct will be scaled according to:

- The seriousness of the offense: More severe violations will result in more stringent consequences.
- The frequency of the behavior: Repeated instances of minor misbehavior may warrant increasingly significant disciplinary responses.
- The impact of the behavior on the learning environment and the safety of others: Actions that disrupt learning or jeopardize safety will be addressed with greater urgency and potential consequences.
- The student's individual circumstances and needs: We recognize that each student is unique, and in some cases, a differentiated approach to discipline might be necessary to support positive behavior, particularly for students with special educational needs. Students receiving services via a Section 504 Plan or an IEP have additional rights. Refer to NSBSD District Procedures to Ensure Discipline of Section 504 /Special Education Students Does Not Violate FAPE (pg. 69).

Our aim is to teach and guide students towards responsible behavior. Disciplinary actions are intended to be a learning opportunity, rather than simply punitive. We encourage open communication between students, parents/guardians, and school staff to ensure that disciplinary processes are understood and that students have the support they need to make positive choices. Any crime committed by a student while at school, on school grounds, or during any school sponsored activity on or off campus, shall be reported to law enforcement (see Level 4 Severe Offences labeled with an asterix\*).

Why is this important? This approach ensures that consequences are not arbitrarily applied and that students understand the connection between their actions and the outcomes. By clearly defining how intensity and frequency influence disciplinary decisions, we promote a sense of fairness and foster a positive school culture where students feel secure and supported while also being held accountable for their actions.

#### AR 5131.6

When any student uses or posses alcohol or illegal drugs at school or while under school jurisdiction, all of the following shall result:

- Parent/guardian contact
- Three-to ten-day suspension
- Law enforcement contact within one school day of the suspension
- Restriction from school activities
- Referral to an appropriate community counseling program with the expectation that at least one counseling session will be held during the time of suspension In addition, the following action **may** be taken:
- Recommendation of expulsion
- Transfer/Alternative Placement

When a student sells or provides alcohol or other drugs at school or while under school jurisdiction, all of the following shall result:

- Parent/guardian contact
- Suspension with possible recommendation of expulsion
- Law enforcement contact within one school day of the suspension In addition, the following action <u>may</u> be taken:
- Notification of law enforcement prior to confronting or searching the student
- A search for drugs in accordance with the provisions of law, Board policy and administrative regulations
- When there is good evidence that a student has actually sold or provided alcohol or other drugs or drug paraphernalia on or about the school premises or at a school-sponsored function, law enforcement must be notified.
- 1. In instances of severe behavior, steps can be skipped
- 2. The grid still allows for administrative flexibility
- 3. Students receiving via a Section 504 Plan or an IEP have additional rights
- 4. Students have a right to due process
