#### Dear NKN Middle School Families,

We have had an amazing two weeks of fully in-person instruction. Students have been actively engaged in lessons, collaborating with peers, and enjoying time with their grade level friends. Although there are several extra safety measures in place, teachers are saying that this is beginning to feel like "normal" school again. I have shared a few pictures below of what our days look like at the middle school.

As we move into October, we get closer to Student Led Conferences. October 21 and 22 are the two days we have set aside for advisory teachers to meet with students and parents/guardians. October 21, teachers will be working from 8:00 am - 8:00 pm to help accommodate those parents who work during the day. Friday, October 22, teachers will be available for conferences from 8:00-12:00. Invitations to sign up for a time that works best for you will be coming very soon. Our goal is to have 100% participation in these conferences, so please check your email for the invitation, and sign up for a time slot.

Student Led Conferences differ from Parent Teacher conferences in that they place students at the helm of the discussions. For this year, our focus is on care and connection. During Advisory, students are investigating the following themes: Who I am, Where I come from, and What I care about. They will select portions of this investigation to share at their conference. Parents will also have the opportunity to give their input during conferences and should be prepared to share the following for their student: one strength they have noticed, one hope they have, and one thing they are grateful for.

One of the traditions for 6th graders at the middle school is Outdoor School. Outdoor School is an opportunity for students to learn about soil, water, plants and animals, as well as other natural sciences specific to our local community and economy. For many children, ODS is their very first experience hiking in a forest, getting their feet wet in a stream or exploring sea life along the beach. This year our sixth graders will participate in a modified Outdoor School at Twin Rocks Friends Camp from October 26 - October 29. This Outdoor School experience will consist of 4 days of camp where students arrive at camp at 9:30 each morning and leave camp at 3:30 to be back to the middle school by the end of the school day. More information will be shared with sixth grade families from the sixth grade teachers.

In closing, I wanted to thank you for being flexible with the many transitions we have had this year and also thank you for sharing your student with all of us at the middle school. It is amazing to be working

with them in person!


Another part of our Family Resource Program is accepting donations of many kinds. If your family has an over-abundance of the items I mentioned above, please feel free to share.


